**State Expenditure**

This bill amends Section 40-43-86(EE) relating to the possession of prescription drugs. The bill authorizes individuals to carry prescription medicines, without penalty, in an unlabeled pill box provided the person can, immediately or within thirty days, produce a valid prescription for the drug or a written statement from the prescribing licensed physician confirming that the physician had prescribed the drug for use by the patient.

The Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation reports that this bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.
