BILL SUMMARY:

This Bill would amend Chapter 22, Title 58 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, by adding Section 59-32-35 to require instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator to all students as a requirement for graduation from high school.

EXPLANATION OF IMPACT:

State Department of Education

The South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) indicates this Bill would have a minimal impact on agency expenditures that could be absorbed with existing resources.

Educational Television

Education Television indicates that this Bill would have no impact on the general fund of this State.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT IMPACT:

SCDE estimates a first year implementation cost to the districts of \$220,347.74. Costs include manuals (\$10,170), DVDs (\$6,777.74), and manikin sets (\$203,400). Costs for Years 2-5 are \$22,045.77 per year which assumes a 10% replacement cost each year for lost manuals and DVDs and lost/broken manikins.
