These definitions are utilized by the South Carolina State Board of Funeral Service when determining unprofessional conduct of a licensed funeral director or embalmer. While the bill modifies these definitions, the oversight or regulatory activities of the Board of Funeral Service and the Department of Labor, License and Regulation will not be materially altered.
