**BILL SUMMARY:**

Senate Bill 305 amends various sections of Title 50 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, relating to saltwater fishing. The Bill revises the geographic boundaries of St. Helena Sound, defines the term "total length" and makes technical changes relating to seafood dealers, crab fishing, minnow trap floats, trawling zone boundaries and horseshoe crab fishing.
