BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 339 amends the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, by adding Chapter 85 to Title 40 so as to enact the "Registered Interior Designer Practice Act" and to provide for the applicability and purpose of the Chapter. The Bill also defines necessary terms, creates the South Carolina Registered Interior Designers Board, and provides for the composition, terms, duties, and powers of the Board.
