**BILL SUMMARY:**

Senate Bill 406 amends Section 44-53-190 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, which contains the listing of all Schedules I, II, III, IV and V controlled substances. The Bill adds new chemicals to the lists, alphabetizes the lists and conform the lists to federal and adjacent state drug designations to improve illicit drug enforcement.
