BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill amends Section 38-73-500(C), Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, relating to random drug and alcohol testing procedures concerning merit rating for workers' compensation insurance; to provide that a single sample may be used for the first and second tests if a second test is administered.
