Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill classifies members of the Anatidae family as migratory waterfowl and repeals statute which created the Migratory Waterfowl Committee and required DNR to produce, promote, and sell Migratory Waterfowl stamps. The expenditure and revenue impact of this bill is pending, contingent upon a response from DNR.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 30, 2020

State Expenditure

This bill classifies members of the Anatidae family as migratory waterfowl. This bill further repeals Section 50-11-20 which created the Migratory Waterfowl Committee. The committee is tasked with managing the selection of the annual commemorative migratory waterfowl stamp design. This section also tasked DNR with providing the production, promotion, and sale of stamps and any related items.

Further, this bill repeals Section 50-9-670 which required a migratory waterfowl permit to hunt or capture migratory waterfowl and required DNR to produce commemorative stamps.

The expenditure impact of this bill is pending, contingent upon a response from DNR.

State Revenue

This bill repeals Section 50-11-20, which tasks DNR with the sale of Migratory Waterfowl stamps and any related items. Funds derived from the sale of these items are used for the administration of the migratory waterfowl stamp and print program. Any remaining funds are expended to benefit waterfowl in the State.

Further, this bill repeals Section 50-9-670 which requires a migratory waterfowl permit to hunt or capture migratory waterfowl. This section requires DNR to produce commemorative stamps and sell them for at least \$5.50. Proceeds are retained by the department and used for the cost of printing, promoting, and producing the stamp and for migratory waterfowl projects specified by the board for the development, protection, and propagation of waterfowl in the State.

The revenue impact of this bill is pending, contingent upon a response from DNR.
