This bill will increase revenue for political subdivisions in Greenville County by \$7,000,000 per year beginning in FY 2018-19 from required payments to the Greenville Health Authority by the Upstate Affiliate Organization.

This bill ratifies and confirms the actions of the Greenville Health System in entering into the amended Master Affiliation Agreement and the Lease and Contribution Agreement with the Upstate Affiliate Organization. This ratification and confirmation is contingent upon the agreement including provisions specified in the bill. The provisions that may affect local revenue include the payment of \$7,000,000 by the lessee, the Upstate Affiliate Organization, to the Greenville Health Authority.

Of this amount, the Greenville Health Authority, previously known as the Greenville Hospital System and later as the Greenville Health System, will receive \$1,000,000 for oversight and enforcement of the obligations of the Upstate Affiliate Organization under the Lease and Contribution Agreement. Greenville Health Authority must use \$4,000,000 to support health-related care, research, and education initiatives benefiting Greenville County residents. Underprivileged communities must receive 25 percent of these funds. Municipalities in Greenville County are allocated \$1,000,000, and Greenville County will receive \$1,000,000 per year. Therefore, this bill will increase revenue for political subdivisions in Greenville County by \$7,000,000 per year beginning in FY 2018-19.
