SC Population Pyramid

The age distribution of the state's population has shifted dramatically since 1970; the median age has increased from 24 in 1970 to 40 in 2020

SC 2030 Population Projections

The median age is expected to increase from 40 to 42 over the next decade; all baby boomers will be older than 65

South Carolina's Population Change, 2010 - 2020 Varied by county from +30.9% (Horry) to -23.4% (Allendale)





South Carolina's Population Change, 2020 - 2040 Varied by county from +68.6% (Horry) to -51.6% (Allendale)





South Carolina Births and Deaths, 1999 - 2022 The number of births remains relatively constant while deaths increased each year until 2022, surpassing births in 2020.

Components of Population Change

Migration into the state accounted for all recent population growth as deaths have outnumbered births in recent years

SC Population by Age Group – South Carolina Population in the 65 plus age range is projected to surpass the under 0-17 age range by 2027

Since the pandemic, growth in Personal Income has stabilized; post-2021 has average annual growth of 6.0% compared to 2015-2019 of 5.3%

General Fund – February 2025 Estimate Collections are 11.0% above last year and \$227.9 million ahead of year-to-date expectations





Sales Tax - Actual vs. Estimate

Fiscal year-to-date revenues are up 4.8%; the large increase in growth is likely due to Hurricane Helene relief efforts and holiday spending and may settle back toward full year expectations of 2.1%
