The above map of Orangeburg and a part of Lexington County, shows the form and position of a proposed new County, to be called "Calhoun." The drawing is from the map of Orangeburg County, made by order of the County Commissioners, at the time the County was divided by vote Township (ca. 1867), with some minor corrections by myself; and the map of Lexington County, made by F. S. Kirtley, in 1868. On the line separating the County against the States within and there still the line A. B. O'Neil takes off.

- And the proposed new line A. D. and Four Miles being in Berkeley line, will take off..... 250 - -
- From Orangeburg County..... 250 - -
