DESCRIPTION OF THE BOUNDARY OF THE
J. P. LEWIS TRACT (311)
EDGEFIELD AND MCCORMICK COUNTIES, SOUTH CAROLINA

All that certain tract or parcel of land, lying and being in Edgefield and McCormick Counties, South Carolina, on the watershed of Rocky Creek, a tributary of Turkey Creek and Savannah River, situate about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles east of the Five Notch Road, about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of S. C. Highway #43, and about 2 miles west of S. C. Highway #25, being covered by the following grants:

All bearings in this description are turned from the true meridian and all distances are expressed in chains.

This property is more particularly delineated on a map thereof, compiled by the U. S. Forest Service, Long Cane Purchase Unit, surveyed September 1934 and January 1935, said map being hereby declared to be part and parcel of this description.

Beginning at Corner 1, an iron pin in a mound of stones, the seventh corner of Dr. A. H. Corley tract (71-1), also common to W. L. Coker tract (91). A scribed 4" pine bears N. 87° E., 0.21 chain distant and a scribed 6" pine bears S. 9° W., 0.30 chain distant.

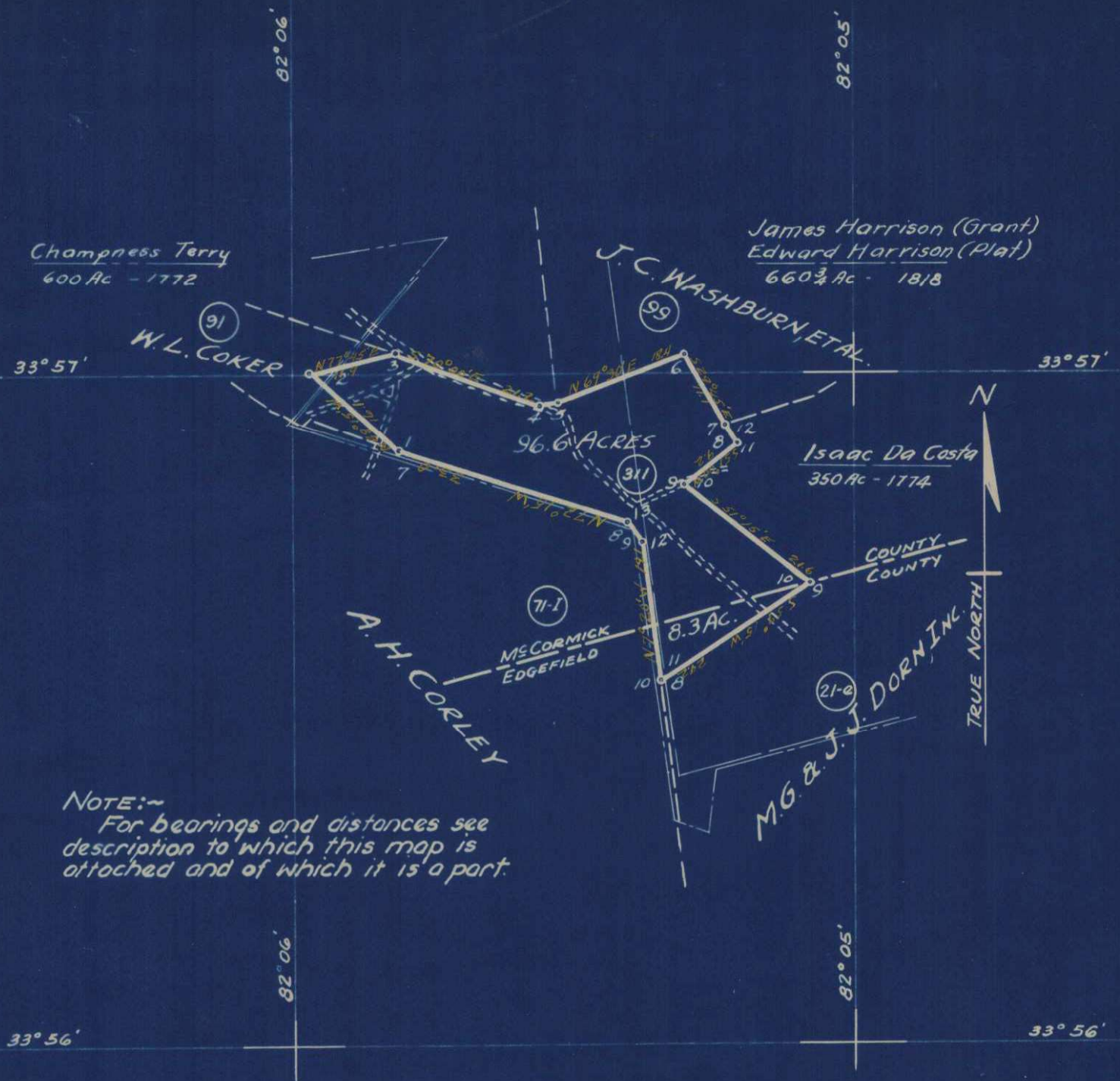
Thence, two (2) lines with Tract 91, reversed, N. $48^{\circ} 15'$ W., 16.1 chains to Corner 2, a 24" dead gum stump, old witness, identified by J. P. Lewis as his corner; N. $77^{\circ} 45'$ E., 11.9 chains to Corner 3, an iron pin, old witness, the ninth corner of Bank of Greenwood tract (24-a).

Thence, two (2) lines with Tract 24-a, reversed, S. $70^{\circ} 00'$ E., 21.2 chains to Corner 4, a point in the center of a road; N. $77^{\circ} 00'$ E., 2.48 chains to Corner 5, a gum stump, old witnesses, the seventh corner of tract 24a and the nineteenth corner of D. P. Washburn, et al. tract (99).

Thence, two (2) lines with Tract 99, reversed,
N. $69^{\circ} 30'$ E., 18.4 chains to Corner 6, a stake set, old witness;
S. $29^{\circ} 45'$ E., 11.1 chains to Corner 7, a pine stump, old witness,
the seventeenth corner of Tract 99, also being the twelfth corner
of W. G. & J. J. Dorn, Inc., tract (21-a).

Thence, four (4) lines with Tract 21-a, reversed,
S. $30^{\circ} 15'$ E., 3.0 chains to Corner 8, a stake set alongside an
old iron pin;
S. $51^{\circ} 00'$ E., 9.2 chains to Corner 9, a stake set alongside an
old iron pin;
S. $51^{\circ} 15'$ E., 21.6 chains to Corner 10, a stake set alongside an
old stake;
S. $57^{\circ} 15'$ W., 24.2 chains to Corner 11, a stake set alongside an
old stake, the eighth corner of Tract 21-a and the tenth corner of
Dr. A. E. Corley tract (71-I).

Thence, three (3) lines with Tract 71-I, reversed,
N. $7^{\circ} 20'$ W., 19.1 chains to Corner 12, an 18" pine, identified by
J. P. Lewis as his corner;
N. $35^{\circ} 45'$ E., 3.3 chains to Corner 13, an iron pin, identified by
J. P. Lewis as his corner;
N. $72^{\circ} 15'$ W., 33.0 chains to the Place of Beginning, containing
ONE HUNDRED AND FOUR AND NINE-TENTHS (104.9) ACRES, be the same
more or less.
