


South Carolina Wireless 911 Fund – Flow Chart

Wireless and prepaid wireless subscribers in South Carolina are assessed a 9-1-1 surcharge fee of \$0.65 each month by the service providers. The wireless service providers (WSPs) and prepaid sellers retain 2% and 3% respectively and remit the remaining funds monthly to the Department of Revenue (SC DOR). SC DOR completes an appropriation transfer of that money directly into the 4955-sub fund in SCEIS. The Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office (RFA) receives a statement from SC DOR showing the total funds transferred which are divided into three portions, 39.8% to PSAP Services, 58.2% to Compliance Costs, and the remaining 2% to Board Operations.



PSAP Services – funds are distributed back to the PSAPs quarterly based on their number of wireless 911 calls for that quarter.

Compliance Costs – funds are distributed back to the PSAPs for cost recovery reimbursement requests. Eligible expenses include purchases, upgrades, and maintenance of 911 equipment and services. The PSAPs must supply supporting documentation (bills, invoices, etc.) with reimbursement requests. This portion of the fund also supports the state contract for a statewide ESInet with NextGen core services at no cost to local jurisdictions.

Board Operations – funds support auditing, administrative, legal, and other program services.
