All bearings in this description are turned from the true meridian and all distances are expressed in chains.

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A survey and plat of the lands hereby conveyed have been made by the United States Forest Service, designated as Tract #278. BEGINNING at Corner 1, a point in county road, established from call, common to W. D. Hardy Estate tract. Set a F. S. standard concrete post marked 407 - 1936 as witness to the corner bearing S. 49° 45' W., 0.34 chain distant. A fence post bears N. 57* E., 0.27 chain distant and a 24" poplar bears N. 17° W., 1.00 chain distant.

THENCE two (2) lines with W. D. Hardy Estate tract, S. 54° 30' W., 11.5 chains to Corner 2, a twin white oak at angle in hedge row. Scribed the white oak and red oak and hickory bearing trees; South., 36.0 chains to Corner 3, a cedar Stake, old witnesses, common to W. D. Hardy Estate tract and Depass and Barron tract (338) being also the fourth corner of Mrs. C. J. Purcell tract (33).





George S. Mower Estate tract (150). THENCE two (2) lines with Tract 150 reversed, M. 46° 15' E., 11.7 chains to Corner 6, a stake set; M. 42° 22' W., 25.6 chains to Corner 7, a stake, the eighth corner of Tract 150, common to J. R. Thomas tract. THENCE two (2) lines with J. R. Thomas tract, N. 75° 00' E., 24.9 chains to Corner 8, a stake in hedgerow. Scribed water oak and ash bearing trees;

S. 86° 00' E., 36.7 chains to Corner 9, a stake, common to J. R. Thomas tract and W. D. Hardy Estate tract. Scribed birch bearing trees. THENCE with W. D. Hardy Estate tract,
