A survey and plan of the lands hereby conveyed have been made by the U. S. Forest Service and designated as tract #51, described as follows:

BEGINNING at corner 1, an iron pipe on hedge row, the eighth corner of Mrs. Carrie A. Shoupe, et al tract (875) and the fourth corner of Blanche H. Gudl tract (58). set a F. D. standard concrete post marked 304-1036. in 8" pine bears E. 65° S., 0.72 chain distant and an 8" oak bears E. 95° S., 1.46 chain distant.

THENCE, with tract 58 reversed,

S. 51° 30' E., 3.25 chains to corner 2, a stake in center of old trail, the third corner of tract 58, being also common to S. D. Summers tract.

THENCE, with S. D. Summers tract,

E. 55° 18' S., 60.43 chains to corner 3, a point at hedge row

intersection, identified by John Eppa as the corner, common to F. D. Summers tract and J. S. Means Estate tract. Set persimmon post and scribed pine and sugarberry bearing trees.

THENCE, with J. S. Means Estate tract,

S. $50^{\circ} 08' \text{ E.}$, 41.8 chains to Corner 4, a 36" pine stump at hedgerow intersection, identified by John Eppa as the corner, common to J. S. Means Estate tract and F. L. Bynum tract. Scribed bearing trees.

THENCE, three (3) lines with F. L. Bynum tract, N. $84^{\circ} 58' \text{ W.}$, 16.7 chains to Corner 5, a 6" oak at Hedgerow intersection, identified by John Eppa as the corner. Set a F. D. standard concrete post marked 507-1936 along-alde and scribed oak bearing trees.

S. $23^{\circ} 04' \text{ E.}$, 16.0 chains to Corner 6, a 10" walnut at angle in hedgerow, identified by John Eppa as the corner. Scribed pine bearing tree.

S. $31^{\circ} 20' \text{ W.}$, 20.7 chains to Corner 7, a point in the center of Moore River identified by John Eppa as site of corner, common to F. L. Bynum tract and H. C. Holloway tract (520). An 18" oak witness corner bears N. 50° W. , 0.75 chain distant. Scribed oak bearing tree.

THENCE, in a southwesterly direction up and in the meanders of the center of the Moore River, passing the ninth corner of Will J. Allen tract 193, common to

Tract 320 at 20.0 chains, 115.0 chains to corner 8, a point in the center of Moore River at hedgerow projection, being in line 8-9 of Tract 128, common to Mrs. Carrie A. Shouse et al Tract. A 14" willow witness corner bears N. 80° E., 1.00 chain. Scribed 4" ash bearing tree.

TRINCE, five (5) lines with Mrs. Carrie A. Shouse et al tract,

N. 52° 16' E., 32.0 chains to corner 9, a fence post, old witness. Set a white oak post and scribed 24" poplar bearing tree;

S. 5° 00' E., 6.40 chains to corner 10, a point on fence line on east bank of branch, with old witness. Set iron pipe and scribed sycamore and water oak bearing trees.

S. 07° 30' E., 0.96 chain to corner 11, a point established from call. Set an iron pipe and scribed pine bearing trees;

N. 32° 00' E., 10.96 chains to corner 12, a stone bearing old marks in old road and hedge. Set an iron pipe and scribed gum and water oak bearing trees;

S. 55° 00' E., 10.4 chains to corner 13, a cr sweet gum stump at fence corner in hedgerow, common to Mrs. Carrie A. Shouse tract and to cemetery lot.

TRINCE, three (3) lines with cemetery lot,

S. 40° 00' E., with fence, 2.68 chains to corner 14, a point in center of road. Fence corner bears N. 40° 00' E.,

0.17 chain distant;

NORTHEASTERLY, with center of road, 5.2 chains to corner 15,
a point in center of road. A fence corner bears N. 40°
00' E., 0.18 chain distant;

N. 40° 00' E., with fence, 2.24 chains to corner 16, a 6"
sweet gum at fence corner in hedgerow, common to the cemetery
lot and Mrs. Carrie A. Shouse tract.

THIRTY, two (2) lines with Mrs. Carrie A. Shouse tract,

bank above east road on north bank of small branch, identified

All that certain tract or parcel of land, lying and being in Newberry and Union Counties, South Carolina, on the waters of Collins Branch and Snoree River, a tributary of Broad River, situate about three (3) miles west of Maybinton, S. C., being covered by the following grants:

All bearings in this description are turned from the true meridian and all distances are expressed in chains.

This property is more particularly delineated on a map thereof, compiled by the U. S. Forest Service from surveys made in 1935 and 1936, said map being hereby declared to be part and parcel of this description.

Beginning at Corner 1, on iron pipe on hedge row, the eighth corner of Mrs. Carrie A. Shouse, et al tract (273) and the fourth corner of Blanche H. Cudd tract (58). Set a T. S. standard concrete post marked 586-1936. An 8" pine bears N. 68° E., 0.72 chain distant and an 8" oak bears N. 85° W., 1.46 chain distant.

Thence, with Tract 58 reversed, S. 51° 50' E., 3.28 chains to Corner 2, a stake in center of old trail, the third corner of Tract 58, being also common to W. D. Summers tract.

Thence, with W. D. Summers tract,
S. 53° 18' W., 60.5 chains to Corner 3, a point at hedgerow
intersection, identified by John Epps as the corner, common
to W. D. Summers tract and J. S. Means Estate tract. Set
persimmon post and scribed pine and sugarberry bearing trees.

Thence, with J. S. Means Estate tract,
S. 30° 08' W., 41.2 chains to Corner 4, a 56" pine stump
at hedgerow intersection, identified by John Epps as the
corner, common to J. S. Means Estate tract and F. L. Nunn
tract. Scribed bearing trees.

Thence, three (3) lines with F. L. Nunn tract,
N. 64° 58' W., 15.7 chains to Corner 5, a 6" ash at hedge-
row intersection, identified by John Epps as the corner.
Set a F. C. standard concrete post marked 507-1926 alongside
and scribed ash bearing trees.

S. 23° 04' W., 16.3 chains to Corner 6, a 10" walnut at
angle in hedgerow, identified by John Epps as the corner.
Scribed pine bearing tree.

S. 51° 50' W., 36.7 chains to Corner 7, a point in the
center of Mooree River identified by John Epps as site of
corner, common to F. L. Nunn tract and H. V. Holloway
tract (320). An 18" oak witness corner bears N. 89° E.,
0.75 chain distant. Scribed oak bearing tree.

Thence, in a northwesterly direction up and with
the meanders of the center of the Mooree River, passing
the ninth corner of Alia J. Wilson tract 128, common to
Tract 320 at 20.0 chains, 113.0 chains to corner 8, a
point in the center of Mooree River at hedgerow projection,
being in line 8-9 of Tract 128, common to Mrs. Carrie A.
Shouse et al tract. A 14" willow witness corner bears
N. 20° E., 1.00 chain. Scribed 4" ash bearing tree.

Thence, five (5) lines with Mrs. Carrie A. Shouse
et al tract,
N. 52° 18' E., 51.8 chains to Corner 9, a fence post, old
witness. Set a white oak post and scribed 34" poplar bear-
ing tree;
S. 5° 00' E., 6.40 chains to Corner 10, a point on fence

line on east bank of branch, with old witness. Set iron pipe and scribed sycamore and water oak bearing trees.
S. $67^{\circ} 30'$ E., 0.96 chain to Corner 11, a point established from call. Set an iron pipe and scribed pine bearing trees;
N. $22^{\circ} 00'$ E., 10.96 chains to Corner 12, a stone bearing old marks in old road and hedge. Set an iron pipe and scribed gum and water oak bearing trees;
N. $55^{\circ} 00'$ E., 10.4 chains to Corner 13, a 6" sweet gum stump at fence corner in hedgerow, common to Mrs. Carrie A. Shouse tract and to cemetery lot.

Thence, three (3) lines with cemetery lot,
S. $40^{\circ} 00'$ E., with fence, 2.86 chains to Corner 14, a point in center of road. Fence corner bears N. $40^{\circ} 00'$ W., 0.17 chain distant;
NORTHEASTERLY, with center of road, 5.2 chains to Corner 15, a point in center of road. A fence corner bears N. $40^{\circ} 00'$ W., 0.18 chain distant;
N. $40^{\circ} 00'$ W., with fence, 2.24 chains to Corner 16, a 6" sweet gum at fence corner in hedgerow, common to the cemetery lot and Mrs. Carrie A. Shouse tract.

Thence, two (2) lines with Mrs. Carrie A. Shouse tract,
N. $55^{\circ} 00'$ E., 0.97 chain to Corner 17, a 20" walnut on east bank above cart road on north bank of small branch, identified by P. P. Shouse as the corner.
N. $1^{\circ} 06'$ E., 17.8 chains to Corner 18, a scribed 18" pine, common to Mrs. Carrie A. Shouse tract and being the eleventh corner of tract 275.

Thence, three (3) lines with tract 275 reversed,
N. $4^{\circ} 04'$ W., 26.5 chains to Corner 19, a stake set;
N. $51^{\circ} 15'$ E., 6.8 chains to Corner 20, a stake set;
S. $65^{\circ} 23'$ E., 31.4 chains to the Place of Beginning, containing SIX HUNDRED EIGHTY-EIGHT AND FIVE THIRDS (688.5) ACRES, be the same more or less.
