INTENT AND USAGE

Bulletin blocks are multipurpose component blocks that allow SCRFA to highlight the information they would most like users to focus on, as well as serve a dual purpose of acting as a place that users can view any updates made to a specific section. This allows SCRFA to prioritize specific content regarding each section of their website, while also allowing users to view recent updates from one central place without SCRFA having to manually record updates every time they are entered.

- Highlights (Section Title)

 - Item title (Link, file, or post)
 Type of Link (attachment, external link, XLS, PP)
 - Date published
- Recent Updates (Section title)
 - May set up to six links of recently updated items for display
- Each link includes:

 - Date publishedLink title (max length tbd)
 - Date updated

Example of the bulletin boards side by side. Left would be reserved for highlights because the English language is read left to right, therefore prioritizing RFA's most important information. On the right are RFA's recently updated updated items automated by the site itself that requires no upkeep from RFA's behalf.

INTENT AND USAGE

Stats blocks are used to display 'at a glance' information about the data that SCRFA manages and maintains. They surface key factoids about the state of South Carolina in a minimal, easy to digest format. They engage viewers to dig deeper into the data to learn more and help clarify to site visitors what SCRFA does as an agency - maintain and provide data to SC residents.

FIELDS

- Stats block header, max length TBD (optional)
- Icon, working from a pre-set list (optional)
- Up to four individual stats, each represented by:
 - a number (to include decimals and percent symbols)
 - a label, max length TBD
 - a footnote / source statement, max length TBD (optional)
 - button link and display text (optional)

Accordions

Accordion



INTENT AND USAGE

Accordions are well-suited for handling a large volume of content on a page without it becoming too visually overwhelming, especially when it can be classified some how such as into Q&A, FAQs, etc. Surfacing the title of a section only allows the user to navigate to (expand) sections of interest. Accordions allow users to easily scan past or skip content that does not interest them. This accommodates a limited number of 'levels' - just a parent (displayed section header) and child (content that displays when the section is opened).

FIELDS

 A page's accordion component is made up of one to several accordion sections. Each section requires a section title and section content, where the content is specified via rich text editor (conceivably the content creator could use the rich text editor to put in an image or other media). Color theme options TBD.

INTENT AND USAGE

Contact blocks are meant to be used when many contacts are being included on a page. They are vertical in orientation because they can be used alone and next to another component such as a text block, or an image, or banner, as well as in a grid when displaying multiple contacts. A visual example of the blocks in a grid is included and be viewed below.
