





SC Population Projections by Age Group Population in the 65+ age range is projected to surpass the 0–17 age range by 2027


SC POPULATION BY AGE RANGE






SC Workforce Population, Age 18 - 64

South Carolina Employment Employment growth has exceeded expectations in recent months


TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT IN SOUTH CAROLINA

UNEMPLOYED PERSONS PER JOB OPENING


United States Seasonally Adjusted; South Carolina Non-Seasonally Adjusted

NUMBER OF PUBLIC SCHOOL CLASSROOM TEACHERS - FY 2017-18 TO FY 2022-23



ROLLING FISCAL YEAR - GENERAL FUND




Sales Tax – Actuals vs. Estimates

Revenues ended \$10.9 million above the estimate for FY 2022-23, growing at 5.9% compared to 5.6% estimated


ROLLING FISCAL YEAR - SALES TAX

Personal Savings Rate


Overall, the personal savings rate has dropped below the pre-COVID trend following the stimulus impact; sales tax growth is likely to slow if consumers start to save more

US HOUSEHOLD DEBT BALANCE BY TYPE



FY 2023-24 BUDGET OUTLOOK, MAY 2023


