


SC Population Pyramid – 1970 41.5% of population under age 20; 7.4% age 65 and over

SOUTH CAROLINA POPULATION PYRAMID - 1970




SC Population Pyramid - 2020 Estimates 24.0% of population under age 20; 18.7% age 65 and older


SOUTH CAROLINA POPULATION PYRAMID - 2020 Projection




SC Population by Age Group Fastest growth in the 65 and older range




U.S. Population Change By State South Carolina has 10th highest total population growth since last Census




South Carolina County Population Top 7 Counties contain 51% of total population




South Carolina Population – Change from 2010 to 2019 Top 5 Counties account for 62% of the total change

South Carolina Population Change – Census Tract Level








Real GDP Growth

Interest RatesFed target range is 0% to 0.25% through 2022




U.S. Retail Sales

S.C. Employment – Total Jobs Sep. 2020 employment has recovered 70% of jobs lost from Feb. to Apr. 2020



S.C. Employment by Sector Most sectors trending well; Leisure & Hospitality still significantly lagging


2020 EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY

Compared to Average Quarterly Wages





In South Carolina, as of September 24 2020, employment rates decreased by 6% compared to January 2020 (not seasonally adjusted).





COVID-19 INFECTION PROJECTIONS - SC






SC Weekly Traffic Counts

Traffic levels have almost recovered and stabilized 5% to 10% below 2019



Spending of Federal \$1,200 Stimulus Payments Recipients spent 42% of stimulus, saved 27%, and used remaining 31% to pay down debt




State Finances

General Fund Revenue by Source – 89% from top 3 items


FY 2019-20 GENERAL FUND REVENUE

Percentage Distribution By Revenue Type (\$ in millions)





General Fund Revenue Growth FY 21 collections are expected to be \$341 m lower than FY 20




Tax Base and Estimates

SC Individual Income Tax by Amount Paid 44% of returns pay 0% of total taxes; 9% of returns pay 60% of total taxes




Individual Income Tax Withholdings – Revenue History Collections are strong, but expected to slow


Sales tax revenue is expected to experience slower growth in the next two fiscal years as it returns to a pre-pandemic trend line


Tax Year 2017 C-Corp Returns and Tax Liability


Corporate Income – Revenue History Projected decline of \$53m in FY 21 and \$23m in FY 22



Corporate License Fees by Corp. Income Tax Liability Range Bulk of license fees paid by corporations with \$0 income tax liability




2017 C-Corp Returns by Corporate Income Tax Liability Range


Corporate License – Revenue History Projected decline in FY 21 and small additional decline in FY 22






General Fund Expenditures by Type Bulk of expenses impact local communities





S.C. Teacher Salary projected to be \$116 above SE average in FY 2019-20






ESTIMATED PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL PROPERTY TAX REVENUE


Assessed Value By County Top 5 counties represent 53% of state property value

TOTAL ASSESSED VALUE BY SCHOOL DISTRICT- TY 2018




Local Government Fund New formula increases funding at growth in the General Fund over the budget base





- Inflation
 - 1.81%
- Population Change
 - Ranges from (2.69%) to 3.18%
 - If population declines, then deemed 0%: 18 counties
 - Note Annexation is not population growth
- Total limit ranges from 0% to 4.99%

- Business License Fee Portal §§6-1-400 & 420
 - Act 176 of 2020
 - Requires RFA to manage and host portal for local Business License Taxes (2022)

 - Fiscal Year 2019-20: 342.4
 - Fiscal Year 2020-21: 346.8

Auditing Topics

- 9-1-1 Audits §23-47-50(E)
 - Requires the "emergency telephone system" fund be included in the audit of the local governments
 - RFA must regularly review audits and report any findings or concerns to the board
 - Funds may be withheld if audits are not submitted or findings are not corrected
- Local Government Financial Report §6-1-50
 - Reports Due by March 15
 - Potential penalty of withholding 10 percent of state funding
