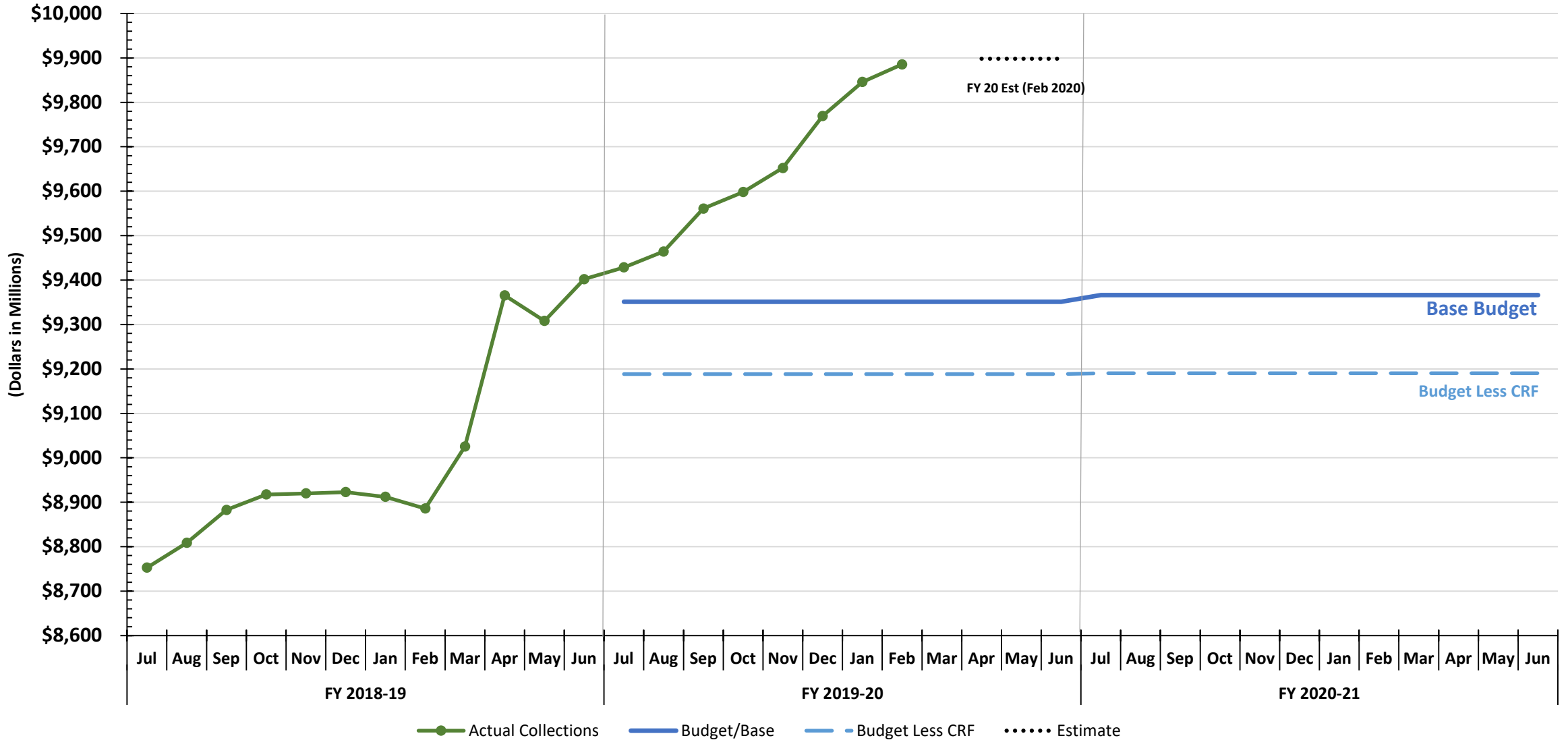

ROLLING FISCAL YEAR - GENERAL FUND REVENUE

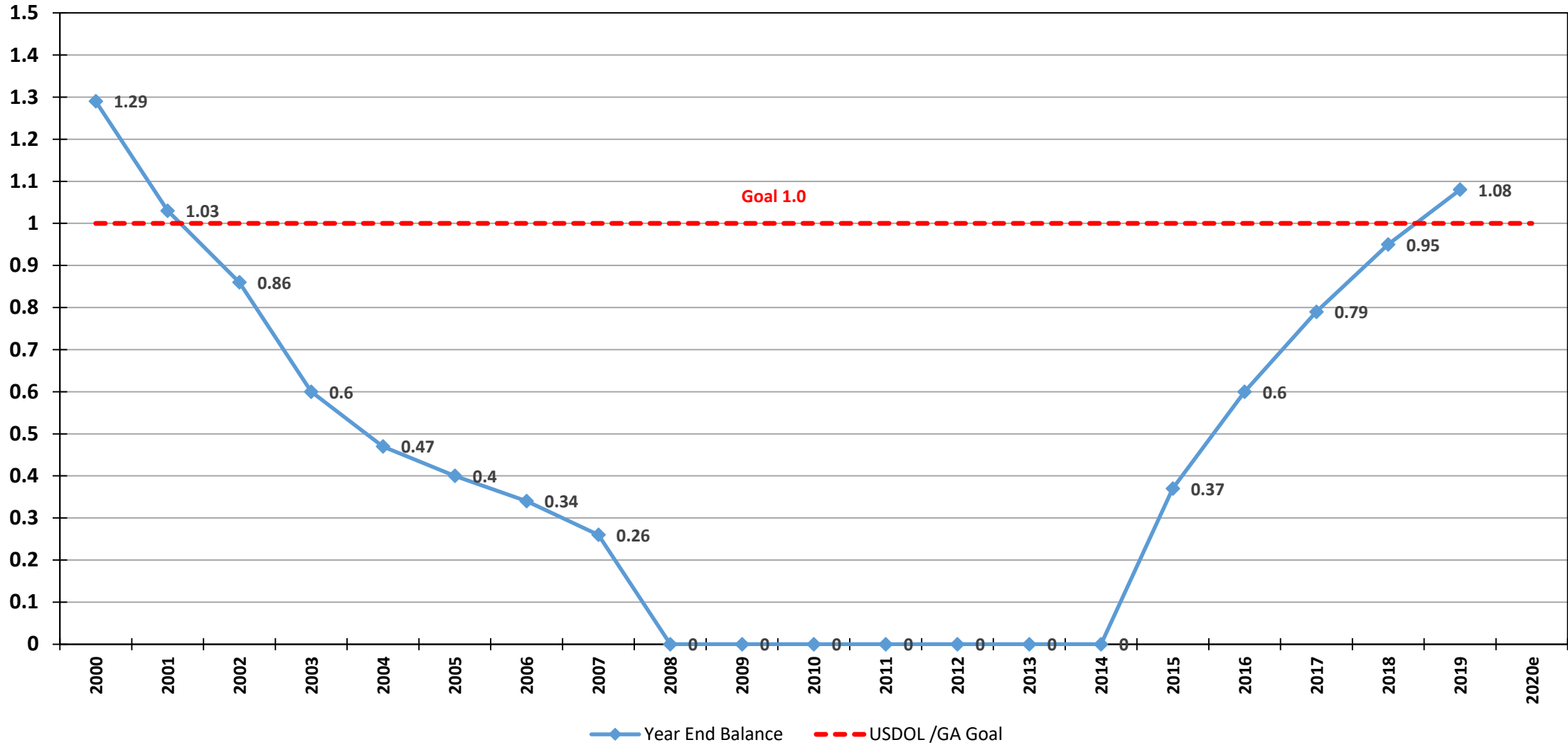
Actual, Estimates, and Base Budget Amount for FY 2019-20 and FY 2020-21 as of February 2020

Ratio of Fund Balance to One Year Payout (Moderate Recession) - Actual vs Goal



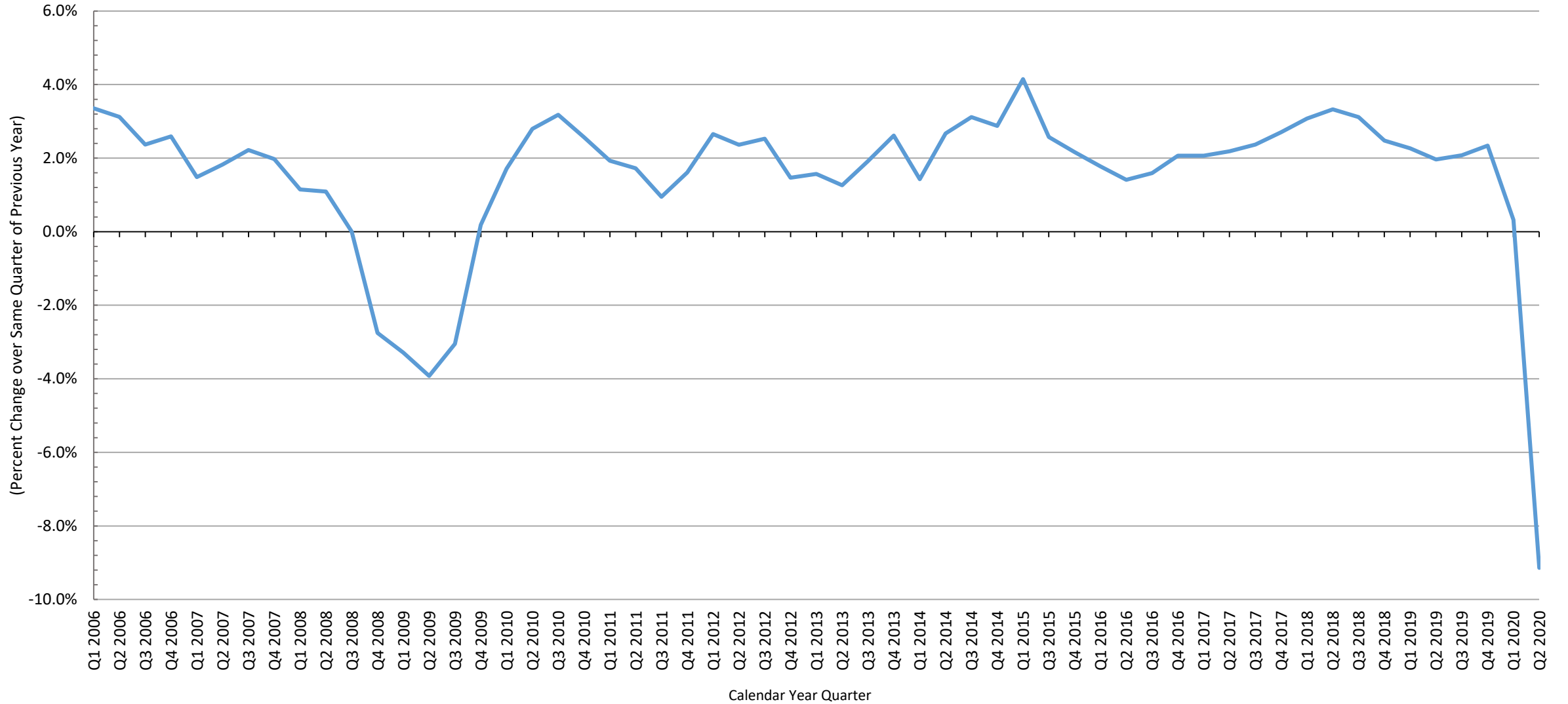

U.S. REAL GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

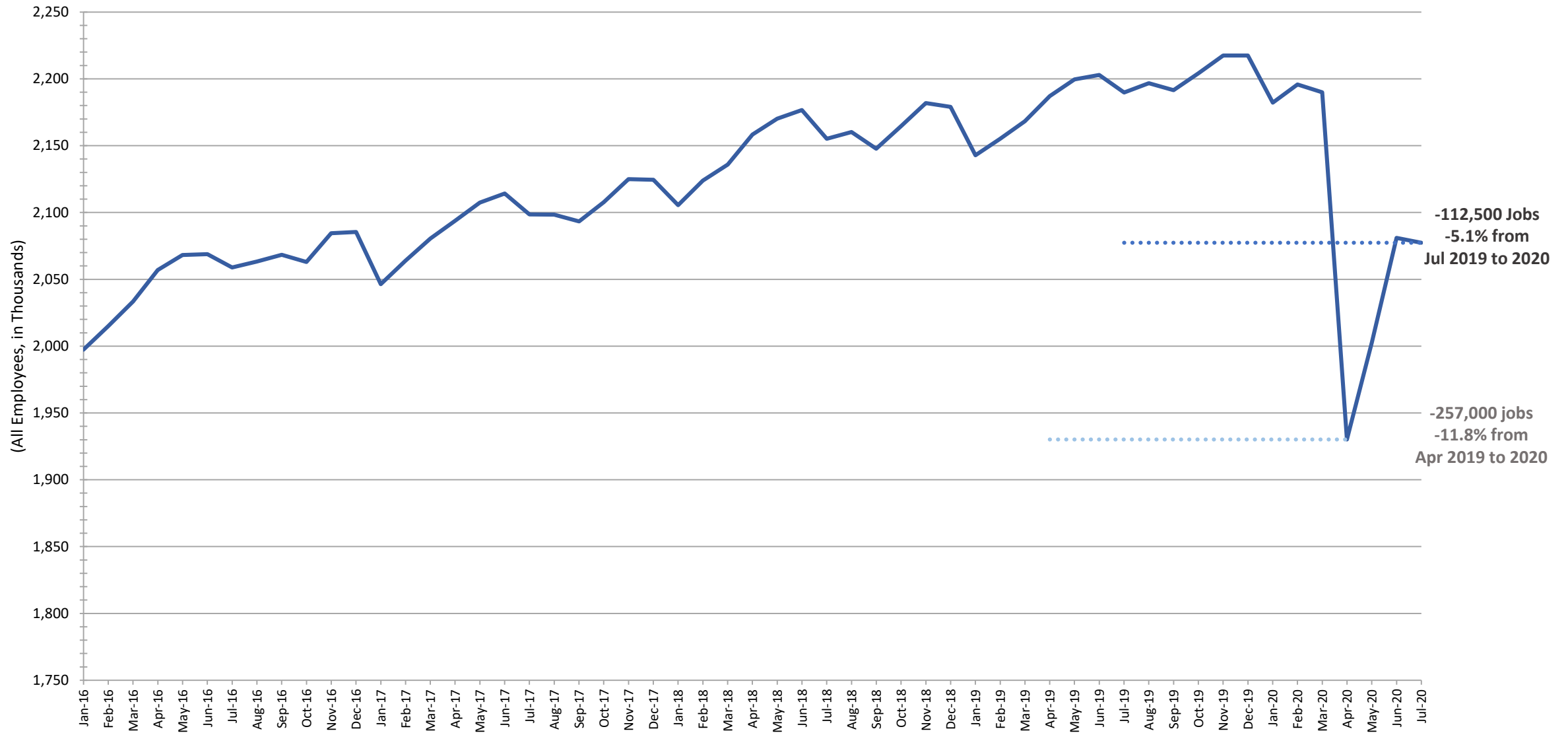
Annual Growth by Quarter

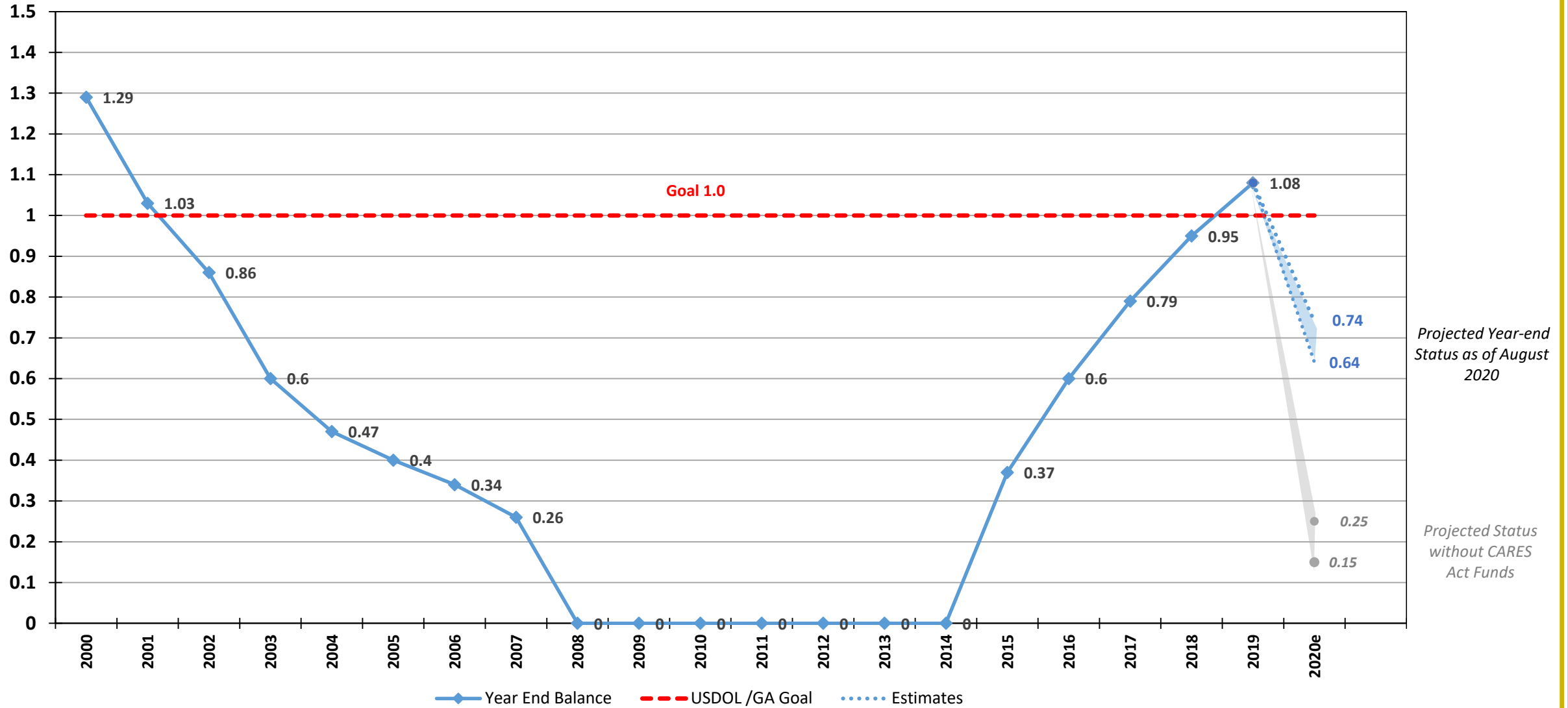
TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT IN SOUTH CAROLINA

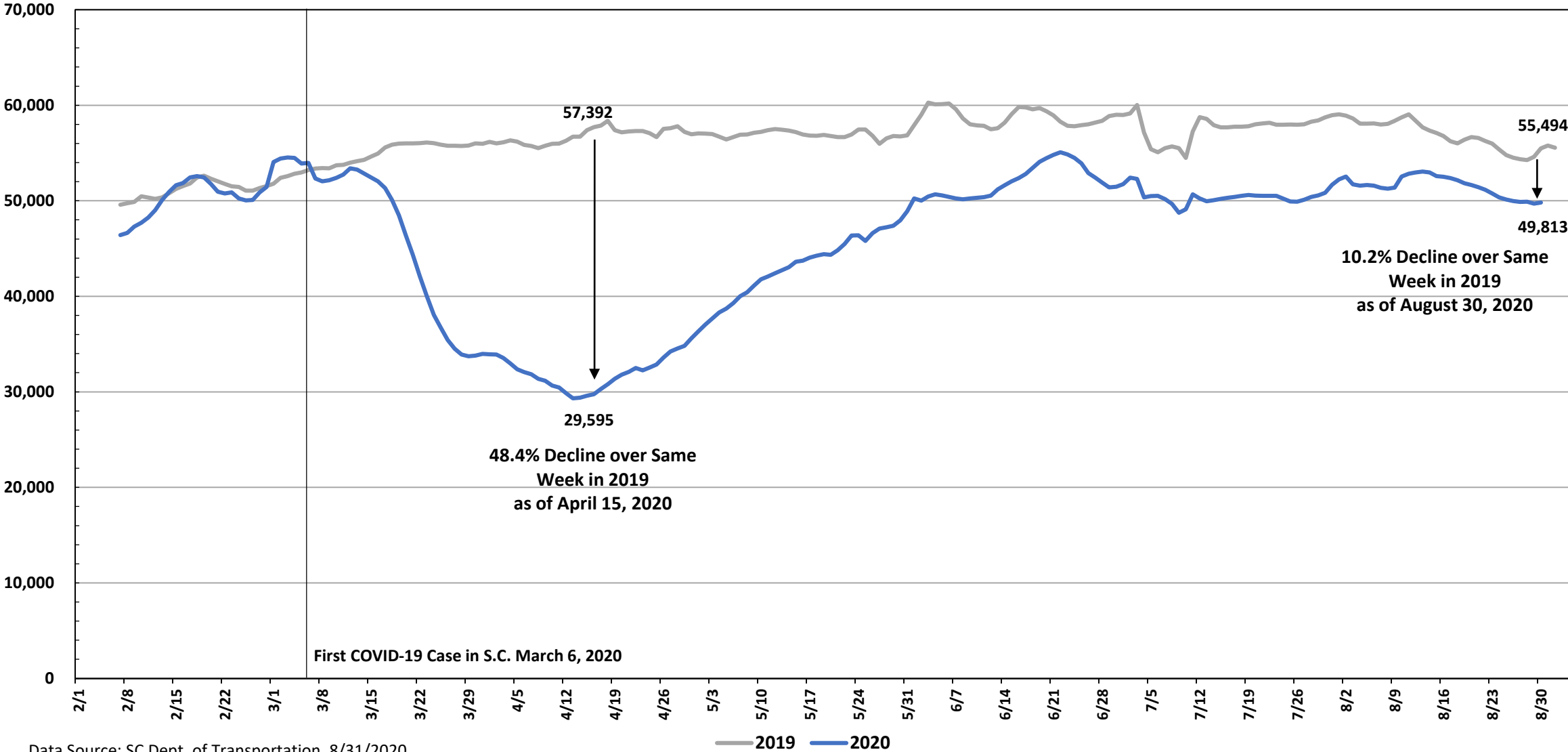
SC UNEMPLOYMENT TRUST FUND STATUS

Uncertainty and Risks to the Forecast



Uncertainty and Risks to the Forecast

- Challenges for businesses include economic restrictions, consumer behavior, and school and day care availability
 - Even greater challenge for hospitality sector
- Increased rates for unemployment compensation for employers
- Potential for layoffs as federal payroll protection program expires on October 1st
- Additional stimulus actions at the federal level
- Income tax liability in April 2021 for tax year 2020 compared to tax year 2019
- Infection rates for COVID-19, particularly entering flu season

COVID-19 Infection Projections for South Carolina

- Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation (IHME) at University of Washington
- Forecasts the **estimated** number of COVID-19 infections daily, (reported infections and estimates of those not tested)
- Gives three projections:
 - Current
 - Mandates easing
 - Universal masks

IHME Projections for South Carolina

Daily infections and testing

Estimated infections are the number of people we estimate are infected with COVID-19 each day, including those not tested.

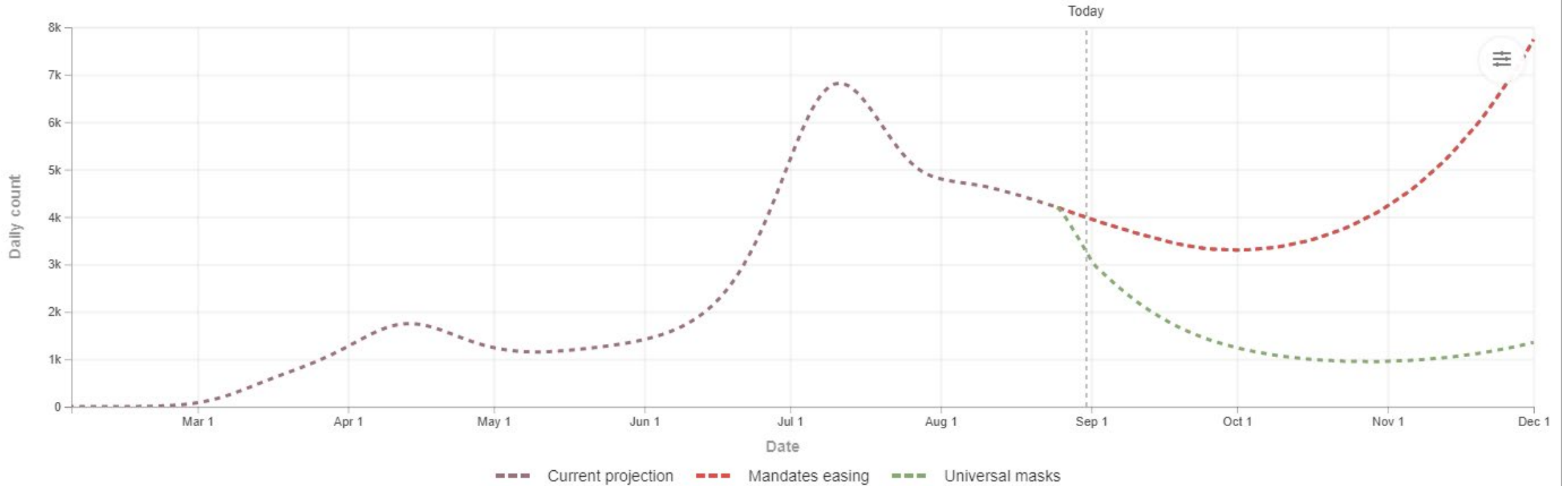

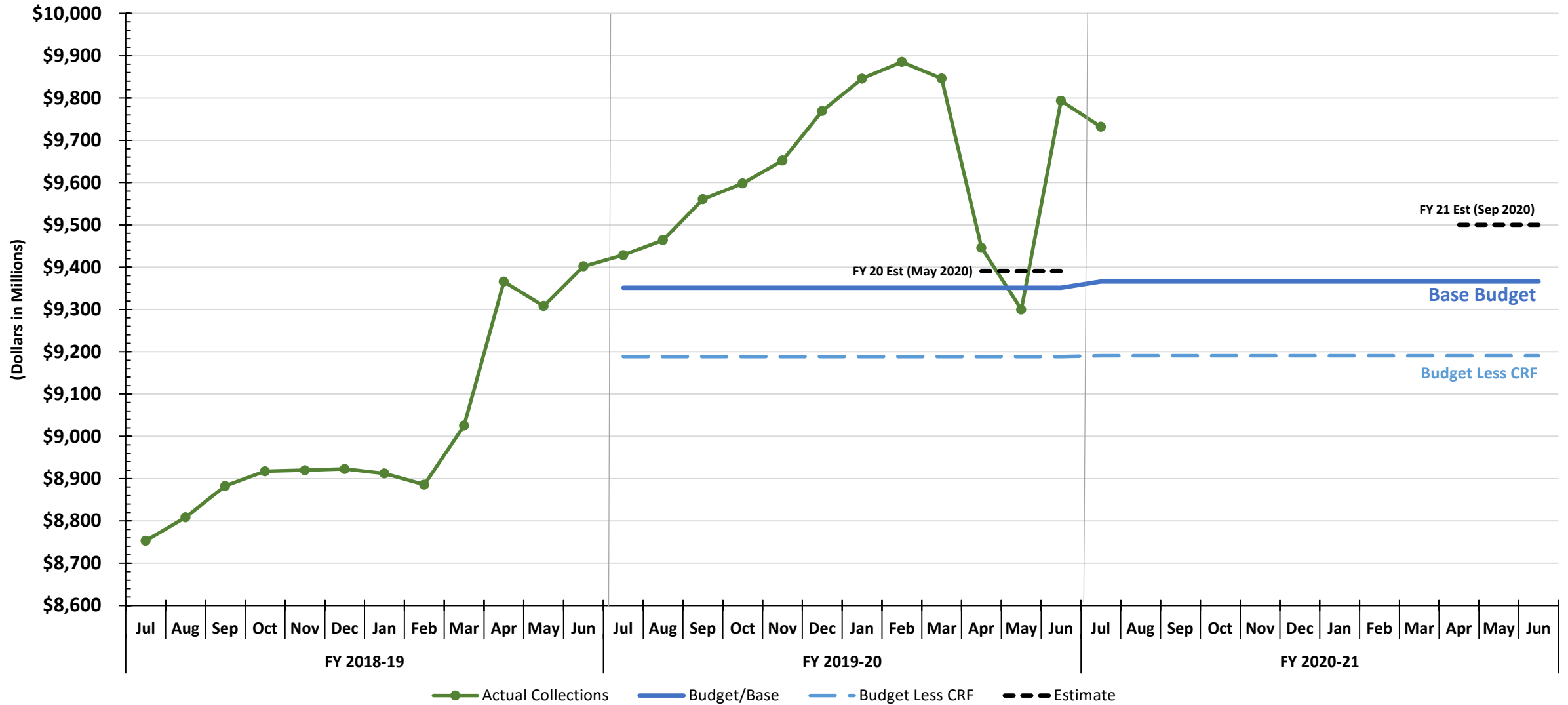


Budget Status as of August 2020

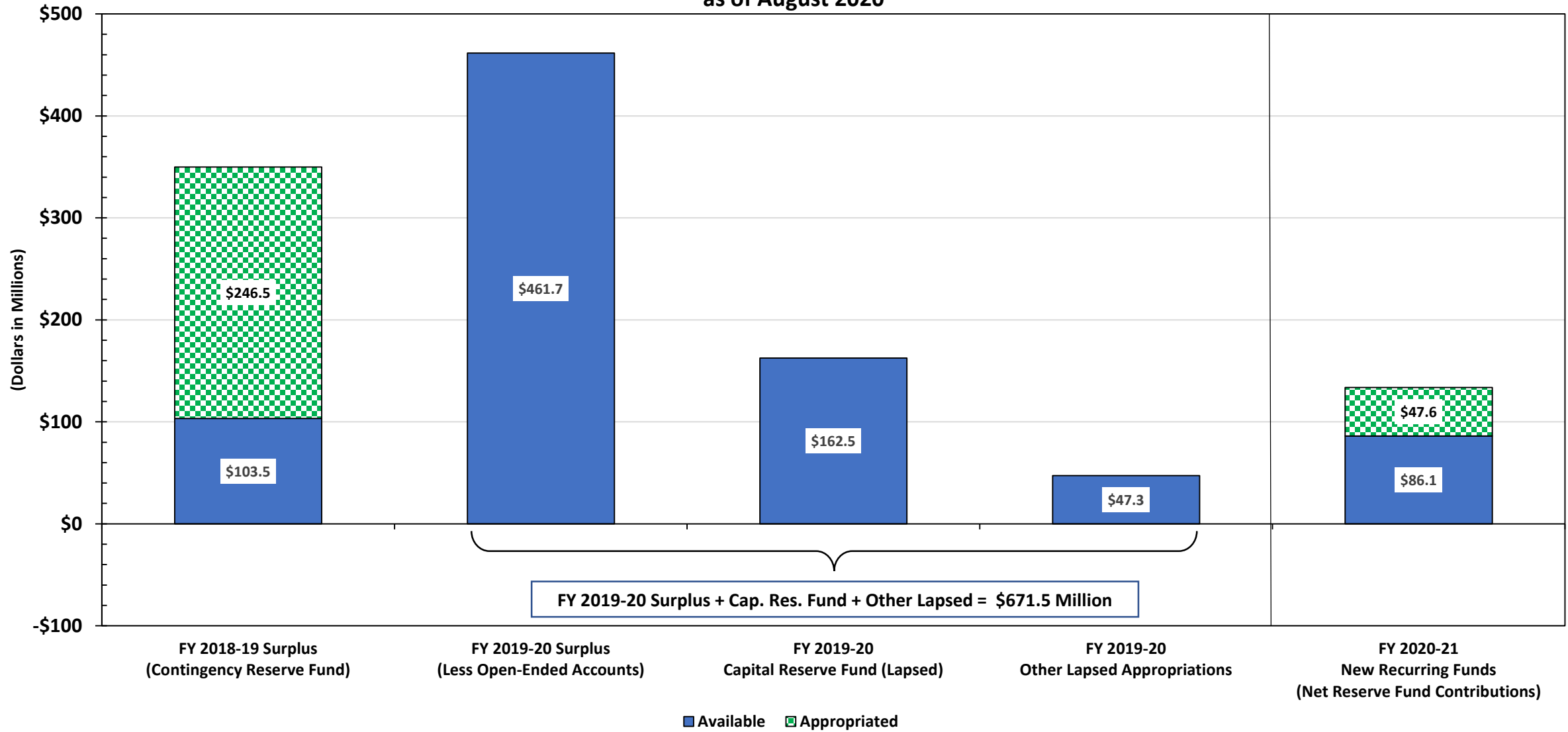
Actual, Estimates, and Base Budget Amount for FY 2019-20 and FY 2020-21
