Subject: Millage Rate Increase Limitation for FY 2017-18 – Inflation Component

This memo is to provide an update regarding the millage rate increase limitations for local jurisdictions for FY 2017-18. While the full millage rate limits will be provided later as the population data become available, we would like to advise you on the inflation component.

The millage rate increase limitation as defined in SC Code of Law § 6-1-320 is the increase in the Consumer Price Index for preceding calendar year plus the percentage increase for the previous year in the population of the entity as determined by the Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office. The Consumer Price Index increased 1.28% from calendar year 2015 to calendar year 2016. This is the figure we will use for the calculation of the millage increase limits. Each political entity's limit will be based upon 1.28% plus any increase in population as applicable.

The millage rate increase limitations for counties and school districts will be published following the release of the 2016 county population estimates by the US Census Bureau. The millage rate increase limitations for municipalities will be published following the release of the 2016 population estimates for incorporated places. For your information, we have included the current release schedule as published by the US Census Bureau below.

Census Bureau Population Release Dates (as of February 13, 2016):

Counties: March, 2017  
Incorporated Places: May, 2016
