BILL SUMMARY:

House Bill 3014, as amended on 5/21/14, amends the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, by striking Sections 2, 3, and 4 of the Bill and inserting Chapter 29 which adds Drug Court Programs in the 16 Judicial Circuits of the State of South Carolina.

EXPLANATION OF IMPACT:

Prosecution Coordination Commission

It is unknown what the statewide fiscal impact would be for this Bill. Currently, there are only 3 Veterans Court Programs in Richland County, Charleston County and Greenville County. The Charleston and Greenville Programs are both divisions of their Drug Court Programs. Some Circuits may be able to absorb the cost of establishing and running a Veterans Court Program but some Circuits may require a part-time Veterans Court Administrator to supervise and coordinate the program.
