Explanation of Amendment by the Senate on May 11, 2016

State Expenditure

This amendment extends the time during which campaign contributions are attributable to a runoff to include the seven days following the runoff. Therefore, as enacted, the bill attributes campaign contributions made on or before the seventh day after a primary to the primary, unless there is a runoff. When there is a runoff, campaign contributions made after the primary through seven days after the runoff are attributed to the primary runoff. The expenditure impact of the bill as amended is unchanged from the bill as filed on December 18, 2014.

The State Ethics Commission indicates that this bill would require changes to the electronic filing system. The expenditure impact would be minimal and can be absorbed within current resources.

Explanation of Bill Filed on December 18, 2014**State Expenditure**

This bill amends Section 8-13-1320 concerning the campaign contributions made on or before the seventh day after a primary is attributed to the primary unless there is a primary runoff. If there is a runoff, a contribution made after the date of the primary and through the date of the primary runoff is attributed to the primary runoff.

The State Ethics Commission indicates that this bill would require changes to the electronic filing system, which can be absorbed within current appropriations.
