BILL SUMMARY:

The Bill would amend the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, to provide that all students must take the exit exam to graduate but not need to attain a minimum score on the exit exam to graduate and that an eligible student who previously failed may re-enroll in high school and will not have to pass the exit exam to receive a high school diploma.

EXPLANATION OF IMPACT:

The State Department of Education estimates a \$400,000 savings in EIA funds appropriated in Section XII.A.2 Special Items: Assessment/Testing.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT IMPACT:

The State Department of Education is unable to quantify the potential costs of the re-enrolled students. The most likely state budget line affected by re-enrolled students is the Education Finance Act, which receives an annual appropriation determined by the General Assembly.
