Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill specifies the tasks that can and cannot be delegated to a certified medical assistant (CMA) by a physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse, and amends the list of tasks that can and cannot be delegated to unlicensed assistive personnel (UAP) by a physician or physician assistant. The expenditure impact of this bill on the Other Funds of the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR) is pending contingent upon a response from the agency.
