**Fiscal Impact Summary**

**Explanation of Fiscal Impact**

**State Expenditure**

The bill amends Section 44-53-360 related to the dispensing of Schedule II controlled substances. The bill authorizes pharmacists to dispense Schedule II controlled substances when presented with a facsimile of the original signed prescription by a resident of a community residential care facility or an assisted living facility. The bill codifies the regulatory authority allowing a pharmacist to treat a facsimile as the original if the prescription is to be dispensed to a home infusion pharmacy, a resident of a long-term care facility, or a hospice patient.

The Department of Health and Environmental Control reports that this bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.
