BILL SUMMARY:

The Judiciary Committee amendment to House Bill 4476 amends Section 56-5-2953(A – D) of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, relating to video recordings made at a stop of drivers suspected of driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of drugs or alcohol, by requiring an audio recording, along with the video recording, be made by the officer at the incident (sobriety or breath test) site.
