Explanation of Amendment by House Education and Public Works on March 14, 2016 **State Expenditure**

This bill declares April of every year Move Over Awareness Month and requires the Department of Transportation and the Department of Public Safety to conduct programs and to emphasize the importance of moving over when approaching a work zone, an emergency scene, or any other traffic accidents. This amendment adds Section 56-5-1539 to require a state government entity that maintains a wrecker or tow truck rotation to allow the driver of the wrecker or towing service vehicle to take traffic incident management training free of charge. The amendment also requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to print information referencing the move over law in future driver's manuals and online editions regarding the requirements of the law.
