#### **BILL SUMMARY:**

House Bill 4732 amends the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, to allow the process for the conduct of presidential preference primaries used in recent years to apply to future primaries, which facilitates South Carolina in retaining the "First in the South" position for presidential primaries. Relating to the conduct by the State Election Commission of party conventions or party primary elections, the authority of political parties to conduct advisory primary elections at party expense, and the date provided by law for holding primary elections and the primaries not subject to that date, this Bill deletes obsolete date references, clarifies the authority of a political party to conduct an advisory primary at party expense, clarifies that the date of a presidential preference primary conducted by the State Election Commission must be set by the party rather than the general state law date for primaries. The Bill also allows the State Election Commission to carry forward any year end balances in its filing fee and primary and general election accounts to the succeeding fiscal year, and it provides that these carried forward funds must be expended for the same purpose.
