Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

This bill adds Section 61-4-945 to allow a manufacturer, brewer, importer, or retailer to offer or sponsor coupons and rebates to a consumer for the purchase of beer. Paper and electronic coupons and rebates include, but are not limited to, retailer instant redeemable coupons and mail-in rebates. Manufacturer, brewer, and importer coupons and rebates must be made available upon request to a licensed retailer. A wholesaler is prohibited from participating in the procurement, redemption, or other costs associated for any coupon or rebate for beer offered or sponsored by the manufacturer, brewer, importer, or retailer. A beer manufacturer or wholesaler is prohibited from offering paper instant redeemable coupons or scan coupons for beer.
