Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Explanation of Amendment by the Senate on May 24, 2016 State Expenditure

This bill requires the Director of the South Carolina Emergency Management Division to develop a re-entry certification system to be included in the State Emergency Plan. This system will authorize a person who transports goods or services or who assists in the restoration of utility or other services to re-enter and remain in an area subject to a state or local curfew. The employer of such a person must be a bona fide company in good standing with the South Carolina Secretary of State in order to receive certification. An employer's certification extends to its employees. This section does not preclude law enforcement or local officials from denying access to an area, nor does it limit the Governor's authority to determine the terms of any curfew.

Office of the Adjutant General. The agency indicates that this bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds. The work would be performed by existing staff and mostly conducted on-line with the production of an electronic certificate.
