BILL SUMMARY:

This Bill would amend Chapter 77, Title 38 relating to restrictions on automobile insurance policies issued or delivered in South Carolina. It would add Section 38-77-127 that would prohibit individualized, electronic monitoring of driving habits for the purpose of transmitting usage-based data of insured drivers to automobile insurers.

EXPLANATION OF IMPACT:

The Department of Insurance expects minimal costs, as there would be no additional filings to incorporate this technology. Several carriers have been using UBI technology and the Department of Insurance would have to notify approved carriers that they can no longer use this type of technology.
