Senate Bill 78 amends Section 16-13-510 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, relating to Financial Identity Fraud by broadening the definition of "Personal Identifying Information" and defining the term "Financial Resources" and provides a venue for prosecution of an Identity Fraud Offense.
