BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 157 amends Chapter 20, Title 37 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, by adding Article 3, entitled, "Caller Identification and Social Media Fraud". This legislation creates the offense of altering the identification of a caller's number or social media identity and provides the penalty for such offenses.

EXPLANATION OF IMPACT:

The Judicial Department and the Department of Corrections indicate that this Bill will have a minimal impact on the General Fund of the State, which both agencies can absorb at their current level of funding.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT IMPACT:
