BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 306 amends Section 50-1-130 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, relating to misdemeanor violations of Title 50 hunting and fishing laws. The Bill increases the maximum fine from \$200 to \$500 and declares that Magistrate courts have original and concurrent jurisdiction over such misdemeanor offenses.

EXPLANATION OF IMPACT:

Department of Natural Resources

The Department's General Counsel estimates that 98% of current DNR cases are already handled by Magistrate's Courts. The Department reports that this Bill would have no impact on the General Fund of the State or on Federal and/or Other Funds.
