BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 423 amends the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, relating to samples and sales of beer at breweries. This Bill specifies that fourteen percent alcohol by weight is the maximum that may be offered for on-premises consumption.

The Department of Revenue and the State Law Enforcement Division both indicate that this Bill will have no fiscal impact on the State General Fund or on Federal and/or Other Funds.
