BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 448 amends the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, by adding Section 40-47-938 so as to provide circumstances in which a physician may enter a supervisory relationship with a physician assistant. The Bill also amends Section 40-47-910, relating to definitions in the Physician's Assistant Practice Act, so as to add and revise certain definitions. Additionally, the Bill amends Sections relating to applications for licensure, off-site setting requirements, prescribing of controlled substances, and on-the-job training. Finally, the Bill amends Section 40-47-995, relating to the termination of a supervisory relationship between a physician and a physician assistant, so as to provide that upon this termination the practice of the physician assistant must cease until new scope of practice guidelines are submitted by a new supervising physician to the Board.
