BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 590 amends Section 50-5-1705(D) of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, relating to the taking of tarpon. Current law limits each person to possessing no more than one tarpon per day. The Bill adds that no one may possess a tarpon that is less than seventy-five inches in fork length.
