**BILL SUMMARY:**

Senate Bill 859 amends the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, to provide that a state building, road, highway, interstate, bridge, interchange, or intersection may not be named for any elected or appointed official, commissioner, director or judge who has not been deceased for a period of five years.
