#### **BILL SUMMARY:**

Senate Bill 865 amends the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, by adding Article 8 to Chapter 23 of Title 58 which establishes the CDL Driver Employment Protection Act. This Bill provides that Civil Liability Claims made against an employer of an individual who holds a valid CDL based on any theory of negligent hiring, training, retention or entrustment must be considered in the second phase of a bifurcated trial, pursuit to Section 15-32-520(E).
