BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 955 amends the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, to provide that a person who retires from a Solicitor's Office may participate in the state health and dental insurance plans regardless of whether the county in which they are employed at the time of retirement participates in these plans, among other things, and to make these provisions retroactive to January 1, 2012.
