BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 900 creates the Study Committee on Expungement of Criminal Offenses to review the criminal laws of the State and determine criminal offenses appropriate for expungement. The study committee must be composed of 3 members of the Senate appointed by the Chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee and 3 members of the House appointed by the Chairman of the House Judiciary Committee.

EXPLANATION OF IMPACT:

The Clerks of the Senate and House of Representatives indicate a cost to the General Fund with this Bill of approximately \$1,050 plus travel expenses per one day meeting of the Committee for the 6 legislative members.
