**Fiscal Impact Summary**

This bill amends the definition of an alarm system business to include a licensed entity that sells by personal solicitation, installs, or services controlled access or card access alarm systems and video surveillance equipment or camera alarm systems.

The fiscal impact of this bill on the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR) and the Contractor’s Licensing Board (board), under the regulation of LLR, is pending, contingent upon a response from the agency.

**Explanation of Fiscal Impact**

**Introduced on December 6, 2021**

**State Expenditure**

This bill amends the definition of an alarm system business to include a licensed entity that sells by personal solicitation, installs, or services controlled access or card access alarm systems and video surveillance equipment or camera alarm systems. Currently, alarm system businesses only include entities that sell, market, service, or install burglar alarm systems, fire alarm systems, or a combination of these systems at a client’s residence or business. An entity meeting this definition must be licensed under the board.

The expenditure impact of this bill on LLR and the board is pending, contingent upon a response from the agency.
