BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 999 amends the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, by adding Section 56-1-218, which would allow an individual who is serving in the Armed Forces of the United States and whose driver's license has expired while the individual is serving outside of this State, be allowed to apply for an extension that lasts up to 90 days after the individual returns to the State or the time the individual is discharged from the Armed Forces, whichever is first.
