This bill creates a ten-member Petroleum Pipeline Study Committee to study matters related to the presence of petroleum pipelines in South Carolina. Staffing is provided by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee. The committee will provide a report to the General Assembly by June 30, 2017 at which time the committee may dissolve. However, if necessary the committee may continue to work until December 31, 2017 at which time the committee must be dissolved. The study committee's final dissolution date change imposed by the amendment would have no additional expenditure impact.

As originally reported, the Governor's Office, Senate, House of Representatives, Department of Health and Environmental Control, and the Office of Regulatory Staff indicate any subsistence, per diem, or mileage can be absorbed within existing appropriations.

# **Explanation of Amendment by the Senate on March 1, 2016 State Expenditure**

This bill creates a ten-member Petroleum Pipeline Study Committee to study matters related to the presence of petroleum pipelines in South Carolina. Staffing is provided by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee. The committee will provide a report to the General Assembly by June 30, 2017 (rather than January 31, 2017 as prescribed in the original bill). The committee is to be dissolved on June 30, 2017. However, if necessary the committee may continue to work until June 30, 2018 (rather than June 30, 2017 as prescribed in the original bill) at which time the committee must be dissolved.

The Governor's Office, the Senate, House of Representatives, Department of Health and Environmental Control, and the Office of Regulatory Staff indicate any subsistence, per diem, or mileage can be absorbed within existing appropriations.
