**BILL SUMMARY:**

Senate Bill 1071 amends Sections 50-1-60, 50-11-120, 50-11-150, 50-11-310, 50-11-335, and 50-11-430 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as they relate to the division of the State into gaming zones, small game seasons, small game bag limits, the open season for antlered deer, the small bag limit on antlered deer and bear hunting, so as to decrease the number of game zones, bag limits and small game seasons. The Bill also repeals Section 50-11-2110.
