BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 1084 amends Sections 44-29-150 and -160 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, by requiring any applicant or employee returning to work in any public or private school, kindergarten, nursery or childcare center for infants and children to obtain a health certificate from a licensed physician certifying that the individual does not have tuberculosis in an active stage.
