BILL SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 1243 amends the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, by adding Section 24-13-180, which provides that any public, private or non-profit entity that is engaged in helping to rehabilitate and reintroduce paroled prison inmates into the community and which have residential housing as part of their program, must provide notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the community where the residential facility is located and must also hold a public hearing regarding the program and the location of their residential housing.
