Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill will have no impact on General Fund, Federal Fund, or Other Fund expenditures.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

This bill amends Sections 25-11-40 and 25-11-60 relating to the removal of county veterans affairs officers and their required semi-annual reporting. Currently, Section 25-11-40 states a county veterans affairs officer can only be removed from office for cause by a majority of Senators and House members representing the county. The bill amends this section and places the officer at will. Section 25-11-60 requires county veteran affairs officers to submit to the legislative delegation of their county a semi-annual report reflecting time spent on their official duties as required by Section 25-11-50. The bill adds the requirement the report be first reviewed by the Division of Veterans Affairs Director. The county legislative delegation can receive feedback from the Division of Veterans Affairs Director regarding the sufficiency of report and the officer's progress with his official duties.

The Governor's Office, Division of Veterans Affairs reports this bill will have no impact to General Fund, Federal Fund, or Other Fund expenditures.

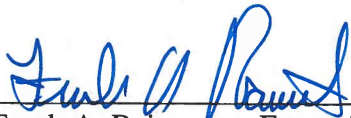
