Fiscal Impact Summary

Senate Bill 48 is not expected to significantly impact State expenditures. All agencies surveyed indicated that the costs associated with implementation would be minimal and could be absorbed.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

This bill creates the Study Committee on Racial Profiling to review state and local law enforcement policies, practices, and procedures regarding racial profiling. The bill also makes recommendations to the General Assembly regarding proposed changes to the laws regarding such policies, practices, and procedures. Furthermore, the bill states that the committee must be composed of three members of the Senate, appointed by the Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman, and three members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the House Judiciary Committee Chairman.

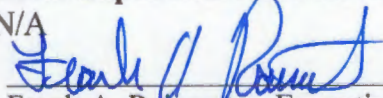
The Senate and the House of Representatives indicate that the costs associated with the implementation of this bill would be minimal and could be absorbed.
