Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill would have minimal expenditure impact on the General Fund, as affected agencies are anticipated to absorb any costs with their current levels of funding. The bill would have no expenditure impact on Federal Funds or Other Funds. This bill is not expected to impact municipal governments. Since our office received no responses from the surveyed counties, we are not able to determine the expenditure impact on county governments.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

This bill adds Section 16-11-605, which deems that the entry upon or above the land of another by a remotely piloted aerial vehicle, or drone, shall constitute an unlawful trespassing violation and establishes penalties for such violations. The provisions of Section 16-11-605 do not apply to law enforcement agencies. Further, the bill adds Section 17-13-180 to require law enforcement agencies to obtain a warrant prior to using a drone for investigative purposes. It also establishes exceptions, provides a civil cause of action for violations, and deems that evidence acquired in violation of the new section shall be inadmissible.

The South Carolina Law Enforcement Division. The agency indicates this bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

Judicial Department. The department indicates that this bill would have minimal expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

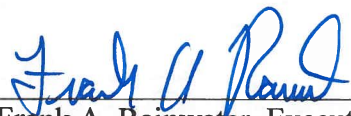
